WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

It has been a busy month for us. As part of our Park, Walk & Talk initiative and due to recent reports from local residents of anti-social behaviour and drug use in parks and open spaces, high visibility patrols were conducted in public spaces and parks

At the latest Acle online Priority Setting Meeting local residents raised the issue of parking in Springfield and the adjoining roads. As a result of this the Local Policing Team have distributed parking information leaflets to each house and we hope this will encourage drivers to park more considerately. A " NO THROUGH ROAD" sign has also been applied for to help prevent the hazard of vehicles turning in the road in this residential area.

South Walsham Road, outside the Acle Academy, was also patrolled due to issues raised regarding student safety when crossing the road. Words of advice were given to several drivers who were parked on the single yellow line during the restricted times and all drivers cooperated with the advice given. Further patrols will be carried out at this location as we work closely with Acle Academy to keep the children safe when arriving and leaving school.

CRIME UPDATES 1st to APRIL

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	2	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	3	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen form a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
